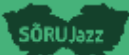




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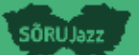

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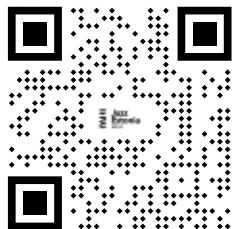

Raimond Mägi & Fabian Dudek

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The duo **Raimond Mägi & Fabian Dudek** was formed at the end of 2024. The group called P999 mainly focuses on fusing acoustic and electronic textures, where unconventional choices and seemingly incompatible sounds come together to create a natural sonic environment with a sense of constant motion. Their debut album *Hiidede sajatus* will be released under Boomslang Records at the end of 2026.



Maria Faust

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Maria Faust, the extraordinary Estonian saxophonist, re-imagines the most militaristic form of music: the march. Traditionally associated with armies and masculine valor, the march is often propagandistic, commemorating victories, or even celebratory and festive.

Sacrum Facere (Latin for «human scarification») was created by Maria Faust in 2014 not just as a band to perform her music, but as a vessel for carrying musical and philosophical ideas. With Sacrum Facere's two previous albums: *Sacrum Facere* and *Organ*, Faust explored the role and purpose of women in society – both Christian and non-Christian – as well as female identity in relation to reproductive rights and responsibilities.

Marches Rewound & Rewritten is a socially critical work that highlights some of the world's oldest pain points – tyranny, hierarchy, violence, and the value of human life. It follows Faust's choral work, *Mass of Mary*, which was dedicated to victims of domestic violence. As with Sacrum Facere's previous albums, the very instrumentation carries deep symbolic meaning. This time, the focus is on the snare drum.

By deconstructing the repetitive elements of propaganda music from dictatorships – turning them upside down, slowing them down, rewinding, and magnifying them – Maria Faust has effectively redrawn the map of the march. In doing so, she exposes it, shatters its pompous lies, and allows it to collapse – thus liberating it.



Kadi Vija 3

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Kadi Vija 3 is a Helsinki-based group whose music is filled with joy and the freedom to explore improvisation and communication. Kadi Vija, often described as a rare instrument herself, brings a unique approach to singing and improvisation, drawing inspiration from instrumental jazz, flowing thoughts, and abstraction. The group's instrumentation and Vija's compositions echo the traditional wind trio format, with the human voice taking on melodies typically played by wind instruments. She is joined by double bassist Mikael Saastamoinen (known from Linda Fredriksson Juniper's band) and drummer Ville Luukkonen.

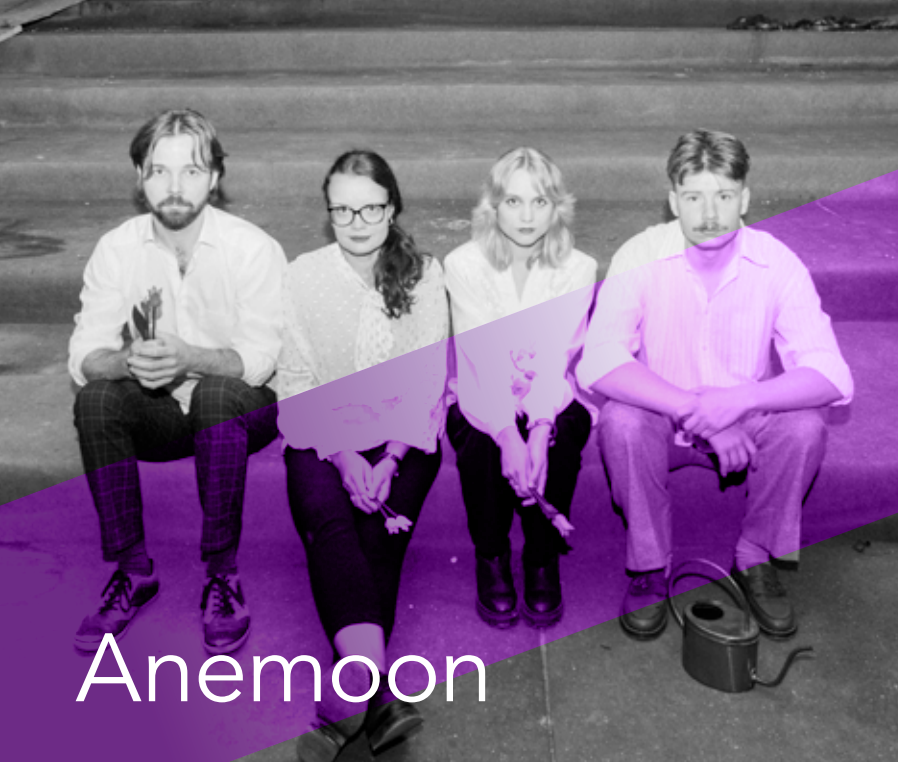
Kirke Karja

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Kirke Karja is a pianist and composer known for her distinctive harmonic language and experimental, uncompromising performances. She is the leader of the international trio Karja/Renard/Wandering.

Anemoon

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The tears of Aphrodite and the blood of Adonis, forsaken love, bad luck, disease, spring frosts and Henri Matisse – mix them all together and wait for the sprouting of the lovely and virtuous, yet poisonous and sorcerous Anemoon.

Anemoon presents original compositions by Anna Regina Kalk and Anett Tamm, offering a female perspective on a world where the value of simply being human seems to be ever-diminishing. It is a world where experience and meaning are sought in superficial beauty, a drug that charms and intoxicates – only to poison and destroy. Anemoon's musical universe is built on sharp lyrics and a delicate balance of trust and provocation, enriched by Robert Rebane on bass guitar and Martin Petermann on drums.



Kristjan Randalu & Martin Kuuskmann

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Ironically, even though they had taken the same school bus to the Tallinn Music High School, which they both attended in the '80s, the pianist and bassoonist weren't introduced to one another until 2003, when the two met in New York. Their musical partnership would start blossoming in the wake of several concerts throughout 2008 with Kuuskmann's record *Nonstop* (ERP).

Inspired by Randalu's recent and critically acclaimed jazz and classical music crossover collaboration with saxophonist Dave Liebman on *Mussorgsky Pictures Revisited* (BMC Records) and driven by the common desire to explore classical music with the freedom of modern improvisation, Kuuskmann and Randalu decided to rekindle their duo and reinvent Schubert's infamous song cycle *Winterreise* through a contemporary lens on *Schubert Voyage* (Berlin Classics, 2025).

Mingo Rajandi Quintet

Mingo Rajandi is a composer, double bassist, ensemble leader, and initiator of interdisciplinary projects. She boldly explores the intersection of refined composition and improvisation, crossing genre boundaries and experimenting with various art forms. In her works Mingo blends jazz with contemporary music, drawing inspiration from socially critical texts and poetry, including both classics and contemporary authors.

Mathei Florea New Grounds

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Mathei Florea New Grounds is a unique ensemble that merges a classical string quartet with a jazz quartet, creating a fresh and dynamic sound that transcends genres. Led by pianist and composer Mathei Florea, the group brings together top-tier musicians whose synergy balances intricate compositions with improvisational freedom. Their debut album *Snap*, released in May 2024, received widespread acclaim, earning Album of the Week on SWR Kultur and Album of the Month on Radio Tallinn. The compositions draw strong inspiration from Petros Klampanis and Arvo Pärt. In 2025, they were named Jazz Ensemble of the Year before their concert at Jazzkaar, featuring guest member Gilad Hekselman.

Itira (formerly Kass-Talsi-Sink)

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Four musicians, four different genres, one shared new form of expression. In the collaboration between Peedu Kass, Villu Talsi, Theodor Sink, and Simone Minn, poetic and tension-filled improvisation is interwoven with elements of classical and traditional music. Together, they explore a contemporary approach to tradition. This genre-crossing collaboration has attracted international attention, with the ensemble performing last autumn at the world music expo WOMEX and releasing their debut album in April 2026.

Anna Regina Kalk

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Anna Regina Kalk is an Estonian guitarist and composer who has studied in Germany and Switzerland. Anna's playing is characterized by a unique blend of lyrical sensitivity, rhythmic complexity, and a bold experimental edge. She is driven by a desire to push boundaries and always seeks fresh sounds and unexpected musical conversations. She performs in various ensembles, including Assonance, Anemoon, Jan Dintheer Large Ensemble, Ulysse Loup Large Ensemble, and many more. In April 2025, she released her new album, *Different Times*, on Neuklang Records with her Swiss-Estonian band, Anna Kalk Quartet.

Alonette

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Alonette enchants with sensitivity, letting her confessional songs and odes to everyday existentialism flow effortlessly, with a lightness akin to child's play. The alter ego of the Estonian singer Anett Tamm, Alonette blends heartfelt folk-pop with a nostalgic nod to the '70s, while embracing modern experimentation.

Her music is filled with bold melodies, vibrant arrangements, and unexpected twists, weaving together bittersweet sentimentality with a fresh, contemporary edge. Her band – featuring some of Estonia's most sought-after instrumentalists – adds depth and richness to Alonette's whimsical soundscape.

Bibi Lotta Ladva

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Bibi Lotta Ladva is an Estonian cellist and composer with a background in classical music, jazz, and free improvisation. By blending the cello's rich timbre with various instruments, she creates music that offers an open space for reflection, inviting each listener to form their own connection with it.

Currently studying in Gothenburg, she is focused on developing her unique sound and leads small ensembles, where compositions evolve through collective creativity.



Anna Lea Haamer

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Anna Lea Haamer is a young Estonian jazz vocalist and songwriter whose music effortlessly blends jazz, soul, folk, and pop influences. Known for her rich, expressive voice and deeply personal songwriting, her eclectic style has drawn comparisons to Nina Simone, Adele, Joni Mitchell, Lianne La Havas and MARO – or perhaps a unique fusion of them all.

Her style is showcased in her two studio albums, *Prospects* (2020) and *Public Transportation* (2024), reflecting her deep connection to nature and the people around her while capturing both intimacy and expansiveness in her music. She is also performing actively in the duo Verlin/Haamer with guitarist Alex Verlin.

Argo Vals is a composer, guitarist, and live electronics artist who has released three full-length solo albums: in 2012, 2015, and 2020. Released in May 2025, his new EP *Lavendel* was created in collaboration with 7D Media, a Santa Fe-based record label founded by instrumentalist and former King Crimson member Trey Gunn.

Opening with the track *Maal maal*, *Lavendel* features six compositions centred around acoustic guitars, enriched with subtle elements of sound design. Departing from the textured electronic layers of Vals's previous album *In Loving Memory Of* (2020), *Lavendel* strips the sound down to its essence, focusing on intricate guitar work, minimal production, and organic instrumentation.



Kadri Voorand

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Kadri Voorand is an award-winning Estonian vocalist, pianist, and composer who has refined her art of emotional storytelling into a powerful musical experience, where magical improvisations weave together jazz and folk traditions. As the artistic leader of the acclaimed Estonian Voices and a captivating solo performer – often appearing alongside bassist Mihkel Mälgand – she moves effortlessly between heartfelt ballads, rhythmic folk influences, and spontaneous improvisation. Described by *Jazzwise* as a performer who leaves audiences «hanging on her every note», her deeply engaging performances transcend language barriers.

Voorand has collaborated with internationally renowned artists as diverse as Kristjan Järvi and NOËP, and has composed for the Grammy-winning Estonian Philharmonic Chamber Choir, solidifying her place as a truly unique voice in contemporary jazz.

Estonian Voices is an a cappella vocal sextet that seamlessly blends jazz, classical, Estonian and African folk traditions into innovative impro-pop. The ensemble features Maria Väli, Mirjam Dede, Mikk Dede, Rasmus Erismaa, Aare Külama, and the artistic director and principal arranger Kadri Voorand.

A three-time winner of The Best Jazz Album Award at the annual Estonian Music Awards, Estonian Voices released their third LP, *Kallimale*, in 2024. The album showcases original compositions and melodies, with arrangements that highlight the unique fusion of six distinct voices.

Their notable collaborations include projects with Take 6, New York Voices, Bobby McFerrin, Estonian Dream Big Band, and other renowned artists.

Mingo Rajandi is a composer, double bass player, ensemble leader, and initiator of interdisciplinary projects. In recent years she has collaborated closely with composer and guitarist Erki Pärnoja. Rahel Talts is a young Estonian jazz pianist and composer who has been actively performing and creating music in Denmark, Lithuania and Estonia, as well as many other countries around Europe. She enjoys composing for various ensembles, particularly larger groups, which led her to form a 14-piece ensemble in Denmark in autumn 2020. Since then, Rahel Talts Ensemble has been performing regularly and has released two albums: *Power of Thought* (2022) and recently, *New and Familiar* (2025). These days, Rahel primarily tours with her quartet, with whom she has performed at prestigious festivals and jazz clubs across Asia and Europe and released two well-received albums, *Greener Grass* (2023) and *Back and Forth* (2025).

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The international ensemble **Ain Agan / Teemu Viinikainen / Mihkel Mälgand / Mika Kallio / Karmen Rõivassepp** was formed by Ain Agan as an instrumental quartet in 2007, bringing together four exceptional jazz musicians from Finland and Estonia. They have performed in many countries and released the albums *Pictures* (2009) and *Now I Know* (2015).

In 2024, they collaborated with brilliant vocalist Karmen Rõivassepp to record *New Moon*, which was nominated for Jazz Album of the Year 2024 at the Estonian Music Awards.



Keelepeksjad
The Backbiters

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The music of **Keelepeksjad** is rooted in the rhythmic and danceable elements of Estonian folk music, blending tradition with energy, improvisation, and a strong guitar presence. Their debut album, *Kalev tuli koju*, was released at the end of March on AVA Muusika.

The band's name, Keelepeksjad, is a playful and multilayered word in Estonian: *keel* can mean a string, a tongue, or a language, while *keelepeksjad* can be directly translated as «string beaters» or «tongue beaters», but also carries the idiomatic meaning of «gossipers» or «backbiters». Such a wordplay with multiple interpretations is perfectly fitting for a quartet with many musical identities.

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Sandra Eowyn Karu is an emerging singer-songwriter from South Estonia, known for her heartfelt, fresh, and lyrical sound. Her debut album, *Handle With Care*, was released in spring 2024, following the success of her first single, *Lapsepõlve Laul (Childhood Song)*, which premiered in October 2022. «Life itself is my greatest inspiration – capturing everyday emotions and weaving them into my music is what excites me most,» she shares. «I love listening to a wide range of musical styles, from Estonian folk and choral music to the works of Yebba, Rozzi, Robert Glasper, Olivia Dean, and my secret guilty pleasure – UK drill.»

JT Conception

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JT Conception (formerly Trump Conception) is a ten-member groove orchestra that explores the borderlands of jazz, funk, jazz-rock, and world music, performing the compositions by award-winning composer and bassist Janno Trump.

Formed in the spring of 2015, the band has released three albums: *One* (2016), *Wait For It* (2017) and *How Far Can You Go?* (2024). With its big band-inspired sound and intense musical energy, JT Conception has become a flagship of Estonia's jazz-funk scene, earning the title of Jazz Ensemble of the Year in 2019. Over the years, the band has collaborated with internationally acclaimed artists such as Nils Landgren and Philip Lassiter, and has performed at numerous jazz festivals in Estonia and abroad.

Recently, Sofia released her album *I Am Soul* and collaborated with Grammy-winning trumpeter Philip Lassiter on the track *Cool and Calm*, further solidifying her reputation as a fearless and dynamic force in contemporary music.

The group has performed in Estonia, Finland, and – during more peaceful times – also in Ukraine, Belarus, and Russia, before Russia revealed its imperialistic ambitions and altered the region's political and cultural landscape.



Kris Dénn

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Kris Dénn, also known as Kristen Kütner, is a talented music producer and guitarist based in Tallinn, Estonia. With a strong presence in the local music scene, he made a notable leap forward in 2023 with the release of his debut EP, *Colors*.

Known for crafting mesmerising melodies and pushing the boundaries of musical innovation, Kristen draws inspiration from a wide range of artists, including Kaidi Tatham, Tom Misch, John Scofield, George Benson, and Jonathan Kreisberg. He seamlessly blends elements of jazz, broken beat, soul, Latin, and funk, resulting in an eclectic fusion that captivates listeners and transcends genres.

In 2020, she received the Young Jazz Talent award at the Estonian Jazz Awards, presented at the Jazzkaar festival. A year earlier, she won first prize in the category of «Jazz Vocal» at Riga Jazz Stage, firmly establishing her presence in the jazz scene.

FESTIVAL AREA

Jazzkaar Festival takes place at Telliskivi Creative City, "a perfectly adequate industrial wasteland, turned into a damn community" as the founders define themselves — culture and business, entwined in a friendly embrace.



The aim of Jazz Estonia is to develop and promote Estonian jazz music both at home and abroad.
